About the Project

A' the Airts is a community organisation and a charity that is a local hub for the community and visitors. The aim of the organisation is to give the local community of Upper Nithsdale a place where they can congregate, converse, and create. Based in Sanguhar, on the main High Street opposite the Tolbooth Museum, the Centre has been operational since 2010.

The Centre is fully accessible with a ramp, a lift, and a hearing loop. The Centre was developed by the community and promotes the arts, crafts, and well-being with daily classes, activities, and events. It has a board of trustees, all local to Sanguhar, a full-time Centre Manager, fifteen part-time staff, and twenty-two volunteers.

In 2023, a 1.2-millionpound extension and refurbishment was completed, doubling the size of the Centre. This beautiful facility is well used by local people and guests. Funding for the extension came from the Holywood Trust, Scottish Government and **Dumfries and Galloway** Council.

Cake, Chat & Create

There is much to see at A' the Airts, every month a local artist has an exhibition in the gallery, there is a café with home baked goods and fresh food, a craft shop where local crafters sell their wares, and it is home to Sanguhar Pattern Designs who produce the knitwear.

A Cinema/theatre space is on the top floor, films, performances, and plays can be seen there. Classes for local children are available all year round and many adults take part in arts, crafts, and wellbeing sessions.

Professional Facilities

There is a hirable digital editing suite with professional film making, music making and graphics software, just as it would be in a professional setting. Local filmmakers use the suite to edit their films.

The organisation won the DG Life Community project of the year in November 2022 and the Centre Manager was one of the top one hundred women in tourism in Scotland, also in 2022.
